Hi! Sorry for the delay with this newsletter, but we had to confirm several things before we could print them. Hope you understand. The next newsletter will be on schedule (hopefully) at the end of September.

LESLEY will appear on Labor Day (September 4) only at Great Adventure, Jackson, New Jersey. Shows begin at 12 noon. Area fan club members have already been notified of this date.

Lesley's scheduled appearance in Boston for August 31 and her engagement at Studio One in California for August 15-20 were cancelled.

Upcoming tentative appearances for the beginning of October are Waaay Off Broadway (Washington D.C.) and Les Mouche Disco, New York City. VERY TENTATIVE UNCONFIRMED DATES are Oct. 3-8 for Washington D.C. and October 11-12 for New York. Definite news in next newsletter. Area members will receive a special card when confirmed.

Lesley appeared at the Grand Finale in New York June 19-24th. She received very good reviews and looked fantastic! A backstage photo is enclosed. Lesley was not feeling too well toward the end of this engagement. For this reason, her Washington D.C. and Philadelphia appearances which were to follow New York had to be cancelled. Lesley put on an excellent show in New York and was very well received at every performance. Some of her reviews:

Cue: "Well, it's Judy's Turn to Cry" because Lesley Gore's back on the performing scene with a more diversified sound..Gore took the stage at Grand Finale II patterlessly crooning pained love ballads and other topflight selections from her album, "Love Me By Name."

Variety: "Performance-wise Gore has a nice way with a dramatic gesture and is not offensively cutesy."

Scho: "...she happens to do some sophisticated material of her own, in addition to being a Sarah Lawrence graduate...."

Billboard: "...She and Ellen Weston write clever songs, boasting intricate melodies and adult themes...These she interprets with spirit and sincerity, and with the resonance and nuances that sometimes recall Streisand...." "Climax of the show was a dramatic update of Gore's classic "You Don't Own Me" more powerful than ever in its lyrical content...."

While in the area, Lesley appeared on the Joe Franklin Show (June 22). She spoke of her fan club and her loyal fans who have stuck by her for 15 years. She also mentioned the fan club's presence at her opening at the Grand Finale.

On Sunday, June 18th, Lesley appeared on New York radio (99 FM) on a one-hour program titled "How to Cope With Success."

Lesley is mentioned and pictured (from the '60's) in the July-August 1978 issue of "Film Comment" Magazine. She is described as "the greatest rock and roll talent since Presley..."

Lesley and Ellen's "Love Me By Name" is featured on Quincy Jones' new A&R album "Sounds and Stuff Like That."

The 1978 Educational Film Catalog lists a film on the Battle Hymn of the Republic which is introduced and explained by Lesley. I had heard nothing of this and was quite surprised. If we ever get together for some sort of convention, we will have to rent this film and show it. It is 11 minutes and in color. No other information.

....As you can see, art was not one of my better subjects. But you do get the picture, I hope!!


So, who has a contest idea? We're open to all suggestions. Of course, I get the final word (smile).
